*1\* Generally speaking, does the federal government have too much power compared to the states? Or do the states have too much power compared to the federal government?*

45%	The federal government has too much power compared to the states
16%	The states have too much power compared to the federal government
24%	The balance is about right
15%	Not sure

*2\* Federal agencies issue regulatory guidance on a regular basis. Sometimes guidance is offered to state and local governments, sometimes to companies. This guidance describes how the federal government will enforce an existing regulation or a law passed by Congress. ### **Methodology**

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on December 2-3, 2024. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
