



Napolitan News Service Survey
of 1,000 Registered Voters
Conducted December 9-10, 2024

1 In fact, news reports indicate that President Biden is considering pardons for many of his administration officials. Should Biden administration officials be pardoned or should Congress have the opportunity to investigate whether these officials committed perjury or other crimes?*

- 29% Biden administration officials should be pardoned
- 58% Congress should have the opportunity to investigate
- 13% Not sure

2 Do you have a favorable or an unfavorable opinion of Dr. Anthony Fauci?*

- 20% Very favorable
- 20% Somewhat favorable
- 21% Somewhat unfavorable
- 23% Very unfavorable
- 16% Not sure

3 Should Dr. Fauci be pardoned? Or should his role in the pandemic and lockdowns be investigated by Congress?*

- 32% He should be pardoned
- 52% His role in the pandemic and lockdowns should be investigated by Congress
- 16% Not sure



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4 How likely is it that Biden administration officials will be unfairly prosecuted by the incoming Trump administration?*

27%	Very likely
26%	Somewhat likely
21%	Not very likely
14%	Not at all likely
12%	Not sure

5 Were Trump administration officials unfairly prosecuted by the Biden administration?*

40%	Yes
43%	No
18%	Not sure

Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on December 9-10, 2024. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
