1 Should the federal government be allowed to review the bank transactions of individual Americans without getting a search warrant? Or should a search warrant be required?*

- 13% The government should be allowed to review individuals' bank transactions without a warrant
- 82% A warrant should be required
- 5% Not sure

2 Generally speaking, should a person's bank records and credit card purchases be considered private information?*

- 87% Yes
- 8% No
- 5% Not sure

3 How likely is it that agencies of the federal government routinely pressure banks to provide private information on the bank customers?*

- 29% Very likely
- 39% Somewhat likely
- 14% Not very likely
- 5% Not at all likely
- 13% Not sure

4 Suppose a government official, without a search warrant, pressures a bank to provide private information on an individual. Should the government official be fired?*

75%	Yes
12%	No
13%	Not sure

Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on February 26-27, 2024. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
