1\* It was recently disclosed that a large number of executive orders issued by President Biden were signed using an autopen rather than by the president himself. Should an executive order signed by autopen be accepted as a legitimate order or dismissed as an unsigned order?

37% Accepted as a legitimate order45% Dismissed as an unsigned order18% Not sure

2\* Okay, several of the pardons issued by President Biden were signed by autopen. President Trump has declared them to be null and void. Should pardons signed by autopen be accepted as legitimate or considered null and void?

39% Accepted as legitimate44% Considered null and void17% Not sure

3\* Some executive orders and pardons signed by autopen were publicly announced by President Biden. Others were released without any public statement. Is it fair to accept the orders publicly announced by Biden as legitimate but to raise questions about whether the others were signed without the president's knowledge?

## Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on March 17-18, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is  $\pm$  3.1 percentage points.
