



**Napolitan News Service Survey**  
of 1,000 Registered Voters  
Conducted April 23-24, 2025

*1\* Suppose a 70 year old man wants to delay receiving Social Security benefits until he turns 75. He would receive slightly higher benefits at age 75, but collect benefits for fewer years. Should a 70 year old be allowed to delay receiving benefits if it makes the Social Security Trust Fund stronger?*

72%	Yes
17%	No
11%	Not sure

*2\* Suppose a 40 year old woman wants to retire earlier by paying higher Social Security taxes for the rest of her career. Should a 40 year old be allowed to retire earlier by paying higher taxes now if it makes the Social Security Trust Fund stronger?*

59%	Yes
21%	No
20%	Not sure

**Methodology**

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on April 23-24, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
