7a* The Bebbington Quadrilateral is defined as the intersection of those who define themselves as a Christian, have had a transformational experience of Jesus, say it is very or somewhat important to share the good news of Jesus, very or somewhat important to speak up for the marginalized, and very or somewhat important to rely upon the Bible to guide personal decisions and actions. This survey found three groups: those who do not claim to be Christians, Christians who reside within the definition of the Bebbington Quadrilateral, and Christians who do not reside within the definition of the Bebbington Quadrilateral. The breakdown is as follows:

Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on April 9-10, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
