of 1,000 Registered Voters Conducted May 5-6, 2025

1* The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) estimates that the federal government will spend approximately \$86 trillion over the next ten years. A budget proposal has been made to reduce that total to \$84 trillion, a reduction of \$2 trillion. Would you say that reducing spending by \$2 trillion out of \$86 trillion is a major cut, a minor cut, a rounding error, or no cut at all?

- 19% A major cut
- 45% A minor cut
- 11% A rounding error
- 12% No cut at all
- 12% Not sure

2* The Republican Budget Plan will reduce projected federal spending from \$86 trillion over the next ten years to \$84 trillion. Is that \$2 trillion spending reduction too much, too little, or about right?

- 7% Far too much
- 10% Somewhat too much
- 23% About the right amount
- 25% Somewhat too little
- 23% Far too little
- 12% Not sure

Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on May 5-6, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
