of 1,000 Registered Voters Conducted May 14-15, 2025

1\* Pharmaceutical companies say that profits from drug sales allow them to do more research that creates new and better drugs leading to longer and healthier lives. If the companies are forced to lower prices, will that reduce the number of new and better drugs created?

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## Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on May 14-15, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is  $\pm$  3.1 percentage points.
