1\* Currently, more than 41 million Americans, or about 12% of the population, are on food stamps. Are most of these people truly in need of government assistance to buy food, or is there widespread abuse of the system?

2\* The government spends around \$100 billion per year on SNAP, the federal food stamp program. Is this too much or too little?

## Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on May 14-15, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is  $\pm$  3.1 percentage points.
