38%	Deport all illegal immigrants
59%	Review each case individually
4%	Not sure

2* If the government is trying to deport someone and they appeal to remain in the United States, where should he or she wait while the case is being reviewed?

32%	In his or her home country
29%	In a supervised facility inside the United States
15%	In the bordering country from which he or she seeks to enter the U.S.
15%	Anywhere he or she decides to travel inside the U.S.
10%	Not sure

3* To reduce the backlog and speed up decisions on asylum and deportations, would you favor or oppose increasing federal spending to hire more judges and otherwise increase the resources available?

26%	Strongly favor
38%	Somewhat favor
17%	Somewhat oppose
8%	Strongly oppose

Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on July 16, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
