36%	Strongly favor
31%	Somewhat favor

*2\* [Among those with school-aged children at home] Would you prefer to send your children to a school where cellphones are banned or one where they are allowed?*

34%	One where they are banned
52%	One where they are allowed
14%	Not sure

*3\* If cell phones are banned, should those bans apply only during tests, anytime students are in class, or for the entire school day?*

17%	Only during tests
59%	Anytime students are in class
22%	For the entire school day
2%	Not sure

**Methodology**

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on July 16, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
