1a [Among all voters] Suppose you had a choice between two states. One had a comprehensive program of educational choice giving parents the ability to choose which schools were best for their children. The other did not offer educational choice and children generally attended the public schools in their areas. Which would you prefer?*

- 41% Not asked, did not say schools were very or somewhat important
- 35% The one with a comprehensive program of educational choice
- 19% The one where children generally attended the public schools in their areas
- 5% Not sure

1b [Among those who say schools are very or somewhat important] Suppose you had a choice between two states. One had a comprehensive program of educational choice giving parents the ability to choose which schools were best for their children. The other did not offer educational choice and children generally attended the public schools in their areas. Which would you prefer?*

- 59% The one with a comprehensive program of educational choice
- 32% The one where children generally attended the public schools in their areas
- 9% Not sure

Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on August 6-7, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
