1 In diplomatic terms, the United States does not formally recognize a Palestinian state at this time. Given the fighting between Israel and Hamas, should the United States change its policy and formally recognize a Palestinian state?*

33%	Yes
34%	No
33%	Not sure

2a [Among all voters] Israel is strongly opposed to formal recognition of a Palestinian State. Knowing this, should the United States support Israel by continuing its current policy or should the United States change its policy and formally recognize a Palestinian state?*

67%	Not asked, did not say the U.S. should recognize a Palestinian state
8%	Support Israel by continuing its current policy
21%	Change its policy and formally recognize a Palestinian state
4%	Not sure

2b [Among those who say the U.S. should recognize a Palestinian state] Israel is strongly opposed to formal recognition of a Palestinian State. Knowing this, should the United States support Israel by continuing its current policy or should the United States change its policy and formally recognize a Palestinian state?*

Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on August 11-12, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
