

## **Napolitan News Service Survey**

of 1,000 Registered Voters Conducted August 21, 2025

1\* Think for a moment about programs related to education, healthcare, and welfare payments. Is it better for the program guidelines and regulations to be set at the federal level so that they are the same for people in all states? Or, should the program guidelines and regulations be set at the state level so that they are suited to the unique needs of each state's residents?

- 40% They should be set at the federal level so that they are the same for people in all states
- 54% They should be set at the state level so that they are suited to the unique needs of each state's residents
  - 5% Not sure

2\* A proposal has been made that would allow states to receive less funding from the federal government for these sorts of programs in exchange for fewer regulations and more control over how the programs operated. Should states be given the opportunity to receive less funding in exchange for fewer regulations and more control over specific problems?

43% Yes

3\* Suppose your state had the option to run education, health care, and welfare programs with fewer regulations and more state control. In exchange, your state would receive 10% less funding from the federal government. Would you want your state to take more control over the programs or to receive more federal funding?

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4\* Suppose a state could agree to take less money from the federal government. In exchange, state residents would have their federal taxes cut by the same amount. If residents received a tax cut, would you want your state to take less money from the federal government?

## Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on August 21, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is  $\pm$  3.1 percentage points.
