*2\* Should the president have the authority to send in the National Guard where he believes it is necessary, even if state and local officials are opposed?*

46%	Yes
44%	No

*3\* In Portland, Oregon, there have been weeks of protests outside the buildings of ICE and other federal agencies. Should the president have the authority to send in the National Guard to protect federal agents and federal buildings, even if state and local officials are opposed?*

52%	Yes
36%	No

**Methodology**

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on September 8-9, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
