1 When it comes to childhood vaccines, how reliable is the advice issued by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)?*

32%	Very reliable
38%	Somewhat reliable
15%	Not very reliable
9%	Not at all reliable
6%	Not sure

2 Who should be responsible for deciding which vaccines are required for children to enroll in school?*

26%	The CDC
25%	Parents
17%	State government
13%	Federal government
10%	Local schools, school boards
6%	Should be no requirements
5%	Not sure

3 Should parents be allowed to opt out of vaccines for their children for reasons of religion or conscience?*

62%	Yes
27%	No
11%	Not sure

Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on September 10-11, 2025. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
