- 55% A completely merit based system

6 Okay, suppose that in a merit-based system, the number of Black students fell dramatically so that only one or two percent of Harvard students were Black. If that were to happen, would you favor a completely merit based system or should preferences be established to increase the number of Black students accepted at Harvard?*

- 57% A completely merit based system
- 22% Preferences to increase the number of Black students
- 21% Not sure

7 Given all of the complexities, should colleges accept students solely based on merit or should preferences be given to ensure racial diversity?*

- 58% Solely based on merit
- 27% Preferences to ensure racial diversity
- 15% Not sure

Methodology

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on January 10-12, 2026. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
