*1\* Is it better for children to be raised at home or in daycare?*

- 72% At home
- 11% In daycare
- 17% Not sure

*2\* For single parents and families where both parents work, daycare is often considered essential. Who should be responsible for providing daycare for lower-income and middle-income families?*

- 23% The federal government
- 20% State governments
- 11% Local governments
- 8% Private and charitable organizations
- 20% Family and friends should help provide daycare services
- 17% Not sure

*3\* Churches and other organizations often provide daycare services and keep costs down by relying upon volunteers. Should such daycare services be allowed to operate, or should all daycare centers be required to rely upon trained professionals?*

- 46% Volunteer run daycare services should be allowed to operate
- 42% All daycare centers should be required to rely upon trained professionals
- 12% Not sure

**Methodology**

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on April 6-7, 2026. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
