Supporters say this ensures that racial minorities are represented in Congress. Opponents say that it is a form of racial discrimination. Should states be able to draw their congressional maps specifically to ensure that racial minorities make up the majority of voters within certain districts?*

64% On a geographical basis with cities and counties not divided up  
19% To ensure that some are controlled by racial and other minority groups  
17% Not sure



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**Methodology**

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on May 5-6, 2026. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
