Of 1,000 Registered Voters

*1\* How closely have you followed news about the Supreme Court ruling on birthright citizenship?*

20%	Very closely
37%	Somewhat closely
23%	Not very closely
13%	Not at all closely
6%	Not sure

*2\* Did the Supreme Court rule that anyone born in the United States is automatically a U.S. citizen, or did the Court rule that children of illegal immigrants are not U.S. citizens?*

63%	The Court ruled that anyone born in the U.S. is automatically a citizen
12%	The Court ruled that children of illegal immigrants are not U.S. citizens
25%	Not sure

*3\* What do you think? Should anyone born in the United States automatically be a U.S. citizen, or should children of illegal immigrants not be given U.S. citizenship?*

58%	Anyone born in the U.S. should automatically be a U.S. citizen
32%	Children of illegal immigrants should not be given U.S. citizenship
11%	Not sure



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*4\* In fact, the Supreme Court ruled that anyone born in the United States is automatically a U.S. citizen. In response, a constitutional amendment has been proposed that would deny citizenship for children born to illegal immigrants. Would you favor or oppose this proposed constitutional amendment?*

- 29% Strongly favor
- 18% Somewhat favor
- 14% Somewhat oppose
- 29% Strongly oppose
- 11% Not sure

*5\* Suppose you had a choice between two candidates for Congress. One candidate favored a constitutional amendment that would deny citizenship to children born to illegal immigrants. The other was opposed. For which candidate would you be most likely to vote?*

- 39% The candidate who favored a constitutional amendment that would deny citizenship to children born to illegal immigrants.
- 45% The candidate who opposed a constitutional amendment that would deny citizenship to children born to illegal immigrants.
- 16% Not sure



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*6\* What do most Democrats in Congress believe about birthright citizenship?*

- 74% Most Democrats in Congress believe that anyone born in the United States should automatically become a U.S. citizen.
- 10% Most Democrats in Congress believe that children born to illegal immigrants should not become U.S. citizens.
- 16% Not sure

*7\* What do most Republicans in Congress believe about birthright citizenship?*

- 18% Most Republicans in Congress believe that anyone born in the United States should automatically become a U.S. citizen.
- 62% Most Republicans in Congress believe that children born to illegal immigrants should not become U.S. citizens.
- 19% Not sure

*8\* What do most U.S. voters believe about birthright citizenship?*

- 43% Most voters believe that anyone born in the United States should automatically become a U.S. citizen
- 24% Most voters believe that children born to illegal immigrants should not become U.S. citizens
- 33% Not sure



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*9\* Suppose a pregnant woman from another country is on vacation in the United States for two weeks. If her child is born in the United States, should that child be a citizen of the United States or a citizen of the woman's home country?*

- 45% A citizen of the United States
- 41% A citizen of the woman's home country
- 14% Not sure

*10\* Suppose a pregnant woman from another country is working in the United States for six months. If her child is born in the United States, should that child be a citizen of the United States or a citizen of the woman's home country?*

- 53% A citizen of the United States
- 34% A citizen of the woman's home country
- 13% Not sure

**Methodology**

This survey of 1,000 Registered Voters was conducted online by Scott Rasmussen on July 6-7, 2026. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by geography, gender, age, race, education, internet usage, and political party to reasonably reflect the nation's population of Registered Voters. Other variables were reviewed to ensure that the final sample is representative of that population.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 3.1 percentage points.
